

POSTURING BUCK-

- TRANSPORTATION & SETUP -

TRANSPORTATION

The DSD Posturing Buck is not designed to be an ultra-portable and easily disassembled decoy. It is designed to have as few seams as possible and be ready to go and not assembled at the hunting sight The decoy can be carried upside-down by grabbing the inside edge of the hole in the bottom side at the chest. Put the ears and antlers inside the body cavity; lay the stake along the length of the decoy body.

FIELD SETUP

At the stand sight, push (don't pound) the stake into the ground right to the paint line. In most instances, you will want your decoy broadside, or quartering toward you. If it's windy, you can slightly splay the legs to keep the decoy pointed in the desired direction. A stand is included for use in areas where the ground is not conductive to using a stake. don't be leery about setting the decoy in fairly tight quarters and don't feel the absolute need to add motion. Remember that sometimes the lack of motion is what will irritate a mature buck and force him in. Additionally, a lack of motion is also what can give a subordinate buck the confidence to come in and check out the decoy.

IMPORTANT SAFETY GUIDELINES: The decoy is for use during archery seasons or for law enforcement by professionals only. DO NOT use the decoy if any rifle, shotgun, or muzzleloader seasons are in progress. WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU WEAR HUNTER ORANGE WHILE TRANSPORTING YOUR DSD

POSTURING BUCK TO AND FROM THE FIELD. Always add the antlers last and remove them first. Use treestands instead of groundblinds to elevate yourself out of a possible line of fire.

ASSEMBLY

STEP 1: Wash decoy and parts thoroughly inside and out with a good scent-free soap and rinse thoroughly so no soap residue is present.

STEP 2: Bolt the two body halves together (DO NOT over tighten the nuts). The use of a deep socket tightened by hand, not a ratchet, will facilitate. Make sure you use ALL bolts! Leave the decoy bolted together at all times.

STEP 3: Push on antlers and ears in the the respective slots. (Antlers and ears are designed to be, and should be, removed during transporation)
